


Campialba

COVID-19 Risk Management Plan



Purpose

The purpose of this risk management strategy is to ensure Campialba is operating in a COVID-safe manner and in accordance with currently required COVID management strategies.

Risk Management Strategies

Area	Strategy	Reference
Dining Room Cleaning	Additional cleaning is undertaken our dining room to reduce potential spread of infection.	
Accommodation Cleaning	Additional cleaning is done in our dormitories to reduce the potential spread of infection.	
Amenities Cleaning	Amenities are regularly cleaned using professional cleaners and approved cleaning chemicals.	
Staff Vaccination	For all camps except those run in-house on behalf of the churches which own Campialba, staff working directly with guests (e.g. in the kitchen and dining room) are required to be vaccinated. Mask wearing	As of 4/3/2022 masks do not need to be worn at Campialba. Guests are welcome to wear masks if they wish.	https://www.qld.gov.au/health
Check-in	As of 7/2/2022 there is no longer a requirement for guests to check in to Campialba using the Qld Check In app.	https://www.qld.gov.au/health
Density Limits	As of 4/3/2022 there are no formal density limits at Campialba. In any case, the maximum number of beds at Campialba is a natural limiter of the total number of guests onsite.	https://www.qld.gov.au/health
Isolation Room	Where-ever possible we allocate a spare room as the isolation room in case a guest tests positive to COVID-19 or is deemed a close contact and needs immediate isolation.	How to isolate - coronavirus (COVID-19)

	That guests is then asked to return home as soon as possible.	
Activities	Groups who book Campialba undertake their own activities. They must satisfy themselves that they are running these in a way which is deemed COVID-safe under any regulations which apply to them.	
Unwell guests	<p>We request that all groups communicate with their guests that any unwell person must stay home. We also request that anybody who is supposed to be isolating at home does NOT attend Campialba.</p> <p>Campialba has the right to refuse entry to anybody who is unwell.</p> <p>If anybody comes down with flu-like symptoms whilst at Campialba they must report this to management and isolate until such time as they are able to return home.</p>

Upcoming easing of restrictions in Queensland

From 6pm AEST Friday 4 March 2022:

- Masks will no longer be required indoors, except in healthcare settings, residential aged care, disability accommodation, prisons, public transport, airports and on planes.
- Masks will no longer be required in schools, including for staff, students and visitors.
- Masks will still be recommended whenever you can't social distance.
- There will be no limit on the number of visitors you can have in your home at one time.
- Venues and events will no longer have density limits.

*Note regarding vaccination status

During school camp bookings, we are operating under the "High Risk" description of Qld Health and as such vaccinations are required of adults onsite. The responsibility to ensure adults working for Campialba are vaccinated is Campialba's. The responsibility to ensure adults attending as guests with the school is the school's. During other camps we are operating as short-term accommodation with shared dining. Qld Health permits unvaccinated patrons to attend short-term accommodation venues. Indoor food access areas at Campialba are not retail, only for the access of single-client booked groups, not accessible by the public and fall under the "shared dining" provisions of the regulations. Unvaccinated people at non-school camps can use these indoor facilities if observing the 2sqm occupancy requirement.
